

#### 1. GENERAL:

- a. Name of Operation: GERONITO I
- b. Dates of Operation: 6 November 1966 to 4 December 1966.
- c. Location: Phu Yen Province.
- d. Control Headquarters: Hqs, 2d Bn (Abn), 502d Inf.
- e. Reporting Officer: FRAPK L. DIETRICH, LTC, Infantry.
- TASK ORGANIZATION: The task organization is listed in 2/502d Infantry OPORD 68-66, and FRAGORDS 69-66 through 74-66.

#### 3. SUPPORTING FORCES:

- a. Army aviation support was used daily except when 2/502d Inf was conducting clandestine operations to locate the VC and NVA units. The support was always immediate and effective. The unit conducted a daylight airmobile assault to begin the operation. In addition to the initial assault, five company moves, 3 platoon moves and one squad move were made during the operation. Resupply, medical evacuation, and command and control missions were performed by US Army aircraft. Gunships were effectively employed against an entrenched NVA Battalion on 9 Nov 66. One helicopter with winch was employed to extract a paratrooper with a broken leg on 9 Nov 66 from a dense jungle. Continual heavy rain and fog caused considerable problems in the effective employment of aircraft.
- b. The companies were provided continuous engineer support by keeping LZ demolition teams with them. These teams assisted in clearing LZ's and PZ's and in destroying mines and booby traps. Maximum advantage is gained if the engineer teams are attached directly to the companies with which they work to preclude difficulty attaching them at a later date.

- c. Tac Air was used on 9 Nov 66 against an NVA Battalion in fortified positions. Due to the close proximity of friendly troops and the possible loss of contact if the friendly troops withdrew, the air strike was aborted after one bomb had been dropped. Red haze was used once to attempt to locate the enemy force. Visual reconnaissance was employed, but bad weather prevented it from being conducted at first light. Flareships were used on two nights with considerable success in exposing the enemy and limiting his movements.
- d. Artillery support was cutstanding during the operation. On 9
  Nov 66 it was employed very effectively against an entrenched NVA force. The
  fire support greatly assisted the Infantry in defeating the NVA force during
  the assault. Artillery was used as a blocking force to complete the encirclement of an enemy force on 2 Dec 66 when bad weather prevented an airborne rifle
  company from making an airmobile assault. For 3 hours Etry A, 2d En 320th Arty
  effectively sealed a gap in the encirclement by firing interdictory fires on
  nine planned concentrations. Artillery was also fired on enemy base camps,
  trail junctions and stream crossings after the Infantry had departed the area.
- e. Attachment of CIDO companies from USSF Detachment 122 (Cung Sen District) increased the combat strength of the 2/502 and greatly improved the relationship between the STRIKE FORCE and Vietnamese irregular forces. The platoons from the CIDO company that were attached from 5 to 13 Nov 66 were attached to airborne rifle companies in 2/502d Inf. The company attached from 13 to 20 Nov 66 was given the mission of conducting Recondo Checkerboard operations and sperated under the control of CPT Walters, the USSF Detachment Commander. The platoons from the company that were attached from 20 Nov to 23 Nov 66 were again attached to the three airborne rifle companies.
- f. The Psy Ops Company provided loudspeakers to induce the members of the surrounded 5th Battalion, 95th MVA Regt to surrender on 11 Mov 66. This effort, in conjunction with the STRIKE FORCE encirclement, proved to be very effective. The same team was used on 2 and 3 Dec 66 to appeal to the enemy to surrender. A total of 59 loudspeaker hours and 1,025,000 leaflets were used.

#### 4. IN ELLI EFCE SUMMARY:

On 6 Nov, the 2/502 Inf and the 2/327 Inf were deployed by heliborne assault into an area South of Done Tre and West of the "HUD", to exploit intelligence of a suspected NVA Division Hqs and the 95th NVA Regiment operating in the area. Throughout the operation, clandestine movements, maximum deception, and thorough searching of the assigned area were the tactics utilized to feel, find, fix and finish the enemy. On 6-8 Nov, several small contacts were made resulting in two VC KIA, and one NVA KIA. Several company size base camps were discovered in the AO and two flare pistols, one U.S. shotgun, one junction box, one amplifier, and assorted SA ammo were captured. On the evening of 8 Nov, a small section of the RECONDO platoon discovered an occupied company size base camp vic BQ934584. The RECONDO element withdrew in a clandestine manner, and reported the discovery to Bn Hqs. To exploit this information, P 2/502 was instructed to orient in that direction along with the remainder of the RECONDO



plateon. C 2/502 and A 2/502 were alerted for deployment to that area if need-

At 0950 hrs, 9 Nov, one RECONDO section made contact with an unknown wize NVA force vic BQ927584 resulting in one SKS captured. Twenty minutes later, the same element made contact with an estimated reinforced enemy platoon vic BQ927578. At this time the RECONDO section was reinforced by a platoon from B 2/502. As the fighting grew heavier, the remainder of the 2/502 was committed. On the night of 9 Nov, the 2/502 was in positions around the exemy force located vic EQ930575. The totals for the days action were: One SKS, two RPD IMG captured, and 7 NVA KIA. On 10 New at approx 0910 hrs vic BQ933577, C 2/502 captured one NVA. From interrogation of this NVA, it was learned that the force with which the 2/502 was engaged was the 5th Bn of the 95th NVA Regt. Throughout the remainder of the day, all elements had several contacts with the NVA force and at 1935 hrs, P 2/502 was probed by NVA elements attempting to escape the encirclement. The NVA probed in an effort to find a weak spot in the encirclement two more times prior to midnight with negative results. At 0030 hrs, 11 Nov, A 2/502 was probed by an unknown size NVA force and at 0340 hrs an estimated NVA platoon size element attempted and failed to break through the encirclement vic BQ936580. The result of this attempt was six NVA KIA, and 3 RPD, 1 SKS, 4 AK-47, and 1 M16 rifle captured. Throughout the day, as the trap was closed and the sweep through the area was made, the NVA, with the exception of a few die-hard squads, seemed to be in a state of confusion and were wandering around in groups of 2-3 men each. As a result of the action 9-11 Nov, and Nov the 2/502 killed 37 NVA by body count, 2 VC by body count, captured 32 NVA, 4 VC, 26 individual weapons, and 14 crew-served weapons as well as assorted field equipment, foodstuffs, and ammunition.

On 12 Nov the RECONDO platoon made contact with two NVA vic BQ933582, resulting in two NVA KIA, one SKS, one 15 watt transmitter/receiver, and one firing quadrant captured. The radio was a Chinese Communist 102E Model radio and the firin quadrant was also a Chicom instrument. At 1525 hrs that afternoon, A 2/502 discovered a small medical cache vic PQ932565. Later, at 1630 hrs, C 2/502 discovered and destroyed a possible hospital complex of approximately 40 beds vic PQ935546. This was possibly the VC District Hospital that was suspected to 'e in the area.

A great deal of information was obtained from the interrogation of prisoners and the translation of documents captured in the period 9-12 November. It was learned that the 5th Bn 95th Regt, due to a shortage of personnel, on 6 Nov, dissolved one rifle company and integrated its troops into the remaining two rifle companies and the heavy weapons company of the battalion. At the tive of the battle, the 5th En had 211 men present for duty strength. All company commanders had gone to the Regimental CP for a meeting. Evidence indicated that the area generally North of Cung Son was the training area for the new personnel of the 95th NVA Regiment. The regiment was understrength and was short ammunition. There were indications that some local VC had been drafted into the NVA ranks as filler personnel. Replacements were expected from North Vietnam sometime in late November or December. One priscrer stated that a weapons cache consisting of approximately 200 assorted weapons was located

within a two kilometer radius of BQ885525, and were cached in three different locations. On 16 Nov, a search of the area failed to locate the large cache, however, several small caches were discovered vic BQ902542 consisting of three individual weapons, two breach blocks for 75mm RR, two 82mm mortar base plates, and assorted ammunition.

On 15 Nov, A 2/502 discovered another medical cache consisting of approximately \$2000 of medical and surgical supplies vic BQ936553. Also, in the same general area, A company captured an NVA who stated that he was a cook in the 5th Bn 95th Regt. He had been wandering around since the battle.

On 18 Nov, C 2/502 discovered a small cache of demolitions equipment and assorted clothing vic BQ892524. Among the demolitions equipment was a Chicom detonating device. One of the articles of clothing captured was a blue sweat-shirt with the letters "CCCP" in white over the left breast. This entire area appeared to be an area where salvage parts and training equipment was stored.

On 19 Nov, only one contact was made. At 1145 hrs, A 2/502; killed one VC and captured one SKS vic BQ936584. The NVA in the area appeared to have broken into small groups and moved either to the North-east or to the East.

On the 20th of Nov, only one contact was made. At 1550 hrs, C 2/502 had cortact with an unknown number of VC vic BQ873537 resulting in one SKS and two Mausers captured. This general area had been booby trapped theroughly with punji stakes and other booby traps such as; CBU bomblets, US AP mines, and numerous hand grenade trip devices. Nothing was found in the area to justify why the enemy would utilize so many booby traps. The majority of the booby traps were located along the trails. All booby traps were destroyed in place.

On 21 Nev, A 2/502 discovered several squad size camps vic BQ863566. Indications were that they were utilized by a small element meving to the East from the area of the battle of 9-11 Nov. At 1112 hrs that afternoon, B 2/502 captured a wounded NVAfrom the 5th Bn 95th Regt vic BQ937586. He stated that he had been with a group of approximately 12-14 NVA who were members of the 5th Bn 95th Regt. They had deserted him when he became ill and slowed them down. He stated that they had moved to the East. Later that afternoon, B Company discovered a medical cache vic BQ9458. This cache was similar to that discovered by A 2/502 on 15 Nov. In both caches, the supplies were stored in metal containers with packing lists on the lids. This cache was approximately 1/2 the size of the one found earlier by A Company in the same area.

On 22 Nov, the RECONDO platoon discovered several khaki uniforms stored in a cave vic BQ8h1552. Several well-used trails were found in the area, all running West to East. At 1125 hrs, A 2/502 made contact with three VC vic BQ9735h7 resulting in two VC KIA and one US carbine captured.

At 1236 hrs on 23 Nov, the RECONDO element picked up one Montagnard male wandering in their area of operation. Interrogation of this man brought out the fact that approximately 40 NVA had been in the area vic BQ8455 but all had left when the Americans entered the area. He also stated that the NVA had hidden a machine gun near the hut in which he lived. A small raiding party dropped in by helicopter at a later date proved that he was telling the truth when he led them to the cache. They discovered a US Model A-6 IMG hidden among the rocks.

On the afternoon of the 23rd, A 2/502 captured one VC with a block of TNT who stated that he was member of the 2nd Company of the 85th VCMF Battalion. He also stated that he had been wounded in a battle several months ago and had been located in a hospital to the West of where he was captured. He stated that all the patients had been removed from the hospital approximately 15 days prior to his capture and that when they had returned to the hospital, they found it destroyed. This was probably the hospital that C company had destroyed earlier.

On Nov 26, C 2/502 encountered two NVA vic BQ882541 resulting in one NVAC, one NVA KIA, and two AK-47 captured. The POW stated that he was a member of the 4th Bn 95th Reft which was located vic PQ8364. As a result of this information, the 2/502 was oriented in the direction of the suspected area.

On 29 Mov, several small contacts were made resulting in one NVA KIA, one SKS and assorted items of field equipment captured. Several company size base camps were found in the area with well traveled trails leading both to the East and to the North.

On the mornin of the 30th, C company contacted a carrying party of NVA vic BQ8346C7 resulting in one NVA KIA and two AK-47, one 82mm mortar captured. Indications were that the NVA forces in the area were trying to escape to the Tast. Documents captured indicated the Regimental Hvy Mortar Company. In the same general area, C Co. later found a base camp and several 82mm mortar sights and assorbed equipment. Again, trails indicated movement to the East.

On the afternoon of the 1st of December, B 2/502 captured one MVA who stated that he was a member of the 18th (Signal) Co of the 95th Regt. Since several documents and POW had indicated the presence of two of the Regimental Spt companies, it was safe to assume that the Regimental CP was somewhere nearby. Trhoughout the remainder of the day, several sightings and small contacts were made with negative results.

On 2 December, A 2/562 ambushed an unknown number of NVA trying to cross the stream from Vest to East vic 20864625 resulting in 15 NVA KIA, one NVAC, three AK-47, one RPG-2, two SKS, two RPD, one receiver fcr SG-43 HMG. The NVAC stated that he was a member of the 6th En 95th Regiment. His party was made up of sick lame and lazy who were left behind when the En had moved four days prior. Three men from the in recon section had returned and were

taking them to the remainder of the Battalian. He did not know where it was. Several more small contacts were made in the same area throughout the day resulting in four NVA KIA, one mortar sight, one light MG, and assorted equipment captured.

On 3 Dec, ^ 2/502 contacted 5 NVA vic BQ865625 resulting in one NVAC, four NVA KIA, one US carbine, one SKS and five packs captured. POW stated that his element was moving from East to West and had not made any contact with American forces prior to his capture. He also stated that a party of apprex 30 NVA were following the lead element of 5 men. Those 30 NVA had moved back up the high ground to the East. Later that day, A Company killed one more NVA in the same vicinity. At 1710 hrs, RECONDO platoon made contact with an estimated NVA platoon resulting in four NVA KIA and one AK-47, and three SKS captured.

The 2/502 was extracted from the AO on 4 Dec, and no further contacts were made.

- 5. MISSION: The following missions were assigned 2/502 Inf during Operation GERONINO I.
- a. 6 through 8 Nov 66, 2/502 Inf conducts airmobile assault and commences RECONDO CHECKERBOARD initially to the west from the LZ's to deceive the enemy and then to the east. The initial phase is clandestine to deceive the enemy. All units are issued five days rations. Plan to converge all forces.
- b. 9 through 11 Nev 2/502 Inf converges on BQ9357 to exploit enemy contact and to kill or capture the VC/NVA forces, use Tac Air, artillery and Psy Ops Team and one company conducts airmobile assault.
- c. 12 through 27 Nov STRIKE FORCE employed a stay behind force vic BQ931576. Conducts RECONDO CHECKERBOARD and a company airmobile assault to southwest to exploit a suspected arms cache. Units return to Tac CP for Thanksgiving and then RECONDO CHECKERBOARD to south and to southwest.
  - d. 28 Nov 2/502 prepares for extraction from AO and moves to P7's.
- e. 29 Nov through 3 Dec RECOUDO CHECKERBOARD initially to south and to southwest. RECOUDO CHECKERBOARD two companies and airlifts 2/502 (-) to west as part of 1st Bde encircling force. Use artillery and Co C, 2/327 Inf to encircle NVA force.
  - f. 4 Dec extracted from AO by helicopters.
  - E. CONCEPT OF OPERATION: (See Inclosure of Sketch Maps).
  - a. 6 Nov conducts aimmobile assault and begins RECONDO CHECK REGARD initially to west to deceive enemy and then to east. Co B given 10 to west to deceive enemy and to check possible enemy position where smoke was seen on 4

Nov by Gunslinger. Initial operation to be clandestine with strict central of aircraft over AO.

- b. 7 Nov: Section, Recondo Platoon blocks to assist 2/327, which is fighting an enemy company that has heavy weapons. All other units continue clandestine RECONDO CHECKERBOARD to the east.
- c. 8 Nov: Section Recondo Platoon released from blocking mission. Recondo Platoon (-) locates a base camp vic BQ936582. Plan for 9 Nov is as follows: Recondo Plat (-) moves to blocking position northeast of objective area vic BQ938582 to prevent movement to northeast. Section, Recondo Platon moves from Tac CP to blocking position northwest of objective area vic BQ931581. Co A conducts airmobile assault, on order, to LZ northeast of objective area and attacks from northeast to southwest. Co B establishes platoon blocking positions south and southeast of objective area and one platoon attacks from northwest. Lst Plat, Co B had to plan to evacuate a man with a broken leg, so lst Plat was approximately 3000 meters west of the remainder of the company. Co C was told to be prepared to move two platoons to blocking positions on the east of the objective area, and Co C (-) would move to blocking positions on order.
- d. 9 Nov: 2/502 begins encirclement of the 5th Bn, 95th NVA Regt. Section, Lecondo Platoon is joined by 2nd Plat, Co B during move to blocking position. Section Recondo Plat, and 2nd and 3rd Plats, Co B develope the situation. Artillery, punships and one air strike are used on the entrenched enemy force. Co C moves to blocking positions. Co A conducts airmebile assault and occupies blocking positions. Encirclement is complete. Illumination from flareship during the night.
- e. 10 Nov: Continued to contract the circle and destroy the NVA battalion. Psy far Team employed from the air. Thumination from Hvy Mort Plat using 81mm mortars during the night.
- f. 11 Mov: STRIKE FORCE continues to close on the encircled force. Requests 2/327 occupy two blocking positions to the north. Uses Psy War Team on the ground and IPW Teams to assist the Infantry. Attacks from south to north with one force while other units hold. Attacks from east to west with one company (-) while other units hold. Thorough search of trees, bushes, ravines, and ditches for NVA soldiers and equipment.
- g. 12 Nov: 2/502 commences to RECONDO CHECKERBOARD in its AO; Co A to east from BQ955576, Co B to west from BQ928577, Co C to south and Reconder Plateon to northwest.
- h. 14 Nov: 2/502 continues to conduct RECONDO CHECKERBOARD in its AO. Co C conducts airmobile assault to BQ889525 to block and RECONDO CHECKER-BOARD northwest on order.

- i. 15 Nov: 2/502 continues its mission. Co A conducts stay behind operation vic HQ93157h. 2/502 (-) begins movement to seize arms caches. REC-ONDO CHECKERBOARD to northwest on order.
- j. 20 to 23 Nev: 2/502 continues to RTCONDO CHTCKERTOARD in its AO, and prepares to conduct airmobile assault to encircle an estimated NVA Battalien.
- k. 24 Nov: 2/502 continues to R CONDO CHECKERBOARD in AO. Sends Co A (-) to exploit reported group of estimated 15 NVA suspected to be in area with heliborne assault to east on designated LZ then to return to AO and continue mission.
- I. 25 to 27 Nev: 2/502 continues to RECOUDO CHTCKERBOARD to the west in its AO. A Co conducts heliborne assault to designated LZ's to northwest to encircle an estimated NVA Battalion.
- m. 27 Nov to 3 Dec: 2/502 conducts RECONDO CHICKERBOARD generally west and north to exploit contacts and encircle and destroy a reported regimental headquarters.
  - n. 4 Dec: Extracts from AO by helicopters and returns to Tuy Hoa.
- 7. EXECUTION: Operation GEROND'O I was conducted from 6 New to 4 Dec 66 in Phu Yen Province.


Operation GERONIMO I began with Co B conducting an airmobile assault at BQ854625 followed by Co C at PQ893533 and Co A at BQ885516. Records Platoon, Mortar Platoon and Tac CP were airlifted to BQ903591. All elements landed with negative contact and initially searched to the west to deceive the enemy. Then all units RECONDO CHECKERBOARD to the cast.

7 Nov 2/327 encountered an enemy company with some heavy werpons to include a heavy machine on and a mortar. 2/327 began overt actions using artillery, helicopters and air strikes after the enemy force was located. 2/502 continued clandestine operations except for artillery in the AO of Co C. Section, Recondo Platoon assisted 2/327 by blocking south of enemy positions.

8 Nov 2/502 RECONDO CHECKERBOARD from east to west along a 11,000 meter front. Co C had sporadic contact with 5-6 man groups vic BQ947548. These groups had automatic weapon: and initiated the action. Section, Reconde Platoon completed the blocking mission for 2/327 Inf and returned to the Tac CP. Reconde Platoon (-) was not detected and moved to northeast to vicinity of BQ942587. Orders were issued by Gunslinger for an attack of this base camp complex on 9 Nov 66.

Sequence of events for 9 to 12 Nov were as follows:

9 Nev 2nd Plat B Co moving to attack positions linked up with Section Recondo Plat vic BQ925584; followed Section, Recondo Platoon as it moved to establish block position vic BQ930584.

1005: Section, Recordo Platoon engaged What 1929575; 1 SKS captured. Continued to push enemy force south along finger. Forces estimated as an enemy platoon.

1010: 2d Plat Co B and Section, Recondo Platton attacked hill vic BQ928574 together from west to east.

1025: 2d Plat Co P and Section, Recondo Platoon enga ed estimated IVA Co; 3 US KIA, 7 US WI' from 2d Plat Co P; 1 US KIA, 3 US WIA from Recondo Platoon.

1039: Two platoons of Co C directed to move into blacking psns vic EQ934575.

1050: Co C (-) directed to move north into blocking positions vic BQ934573.

1115: Helicopters requested on standby to lift Co A.

1130: "Dust Off", C&C and gunships requested.

1150: Co A alerted for more from P7 PQ938518 to LZ BQ950584 to block at BQ938582.

1200: 4th Plat Co B arrived at BQ920568 in blocking position.

1205: Recordo (-) at a blocking position at BQ938581.

1210: 3d Plat Co B in position BQ927571; observed Hvy MG firing on Recondo's; while moving to attack Hvy MG, encountered large enemy force; 1 US WIA, enemy casualties unknown.

1215: Helicopter requested for ammo resupply.

1225: C&C arrived at Tac CP.

1255: Helicopters were supposed to take off to pick up Co A. Difficulty with commo to Ede Tac CP at Dong Tre.

1345: Helicopters arrived at PZ at EQ938518 to move Co A.

1425: Co B engaged 3 VC at BQ928568 resulting in 1 RPD captured.

1430: 1st Plat Co C engaged 1 NVA at BQ947570 with AK-47; neg results.

1435: Ammo resupply arrived at Tac CP.

1440: Airstrike commenced at EQ930571.

1448: One bomb load dropped. Airstrike aborted due to close preximity of friendly elements.

1500: 2d and 3d plat Co B and Section, Recondo Plat broke contact and began movement of friendly TA and KIA to PZ vic BQ928575.

0840: Co C 1 VC KIA at PQ933576.

3905: Co C engaged 2 NVA at BQ933576; 1 NVAKIA, 1 NVA captured.

1023: Psy War Team requested.

1250: Co A engaged unknown size force at EQ932577; 8 NVA KIA, 1 RPD, 2 SKS, 1 KK-h7.

On 15 Nov Co Aremained as a stay behind force vic BC 31576. Co B found weapons cache vic PQ904547. Co C conducted airmobile assault; contact vic BQ855526.

On 16 Nov Co Acontinued on stay behind operation. Co's B and C continued to Recordo Checkerboard. THC destroyed downed helicopter near Tac CP.

On 17 Nov Co Ahad light contact vic BQ938581. Co C found a cache vic BQ892524. Recondo Platoon had light contact vic BQ870525.

From 18 to 20 Nov continued Reconde Checkerboard in 10; Co's B and C had light contact on 20 Nov; the Tac CP displaced to BQ945591 on 20 Nov.

On 21 Nov Co Ahad light contact vic BQ973547 and &o B had light contact vic BQ934578.

From 22 to 24 Nov companies closed into Tac CP to observe Thanksgiving Day. Co . (-) exploited an area vic BQ975561 with negative contact on the morning of 24 Nov.

On 25 Mov Co C had light contact vic PQ953553. Other units continued to Recondo Checkerboard in 10's.

On 26 Nev Co C had light contact vic BQ877543. Co A and Co B centinued to Recordo Checkerboard. Recordo Plateon took a 10 man raiding party and made a helicopter assault to exploit information from a Montagnard, which resulted in an A-6.30 Cal MG, vic BQ839549.

On 27 Nov and 28 Nov companies made preparation for extracting from AO by moving to PZ's. Extraction postponed.

On 27 Nov Tac CP Recondo Plateon and Mortar Platoon moved to BQ872624. Co's B and C had light contact while Recondo Checkerboarding under execution of new FRAGORD 75-66 (GERONI O I).

On 30 Nov and 1 Dec comparies continued to Recondo Checkerboard in AO's with light contact resulting in several NVC/VC KI. and assorted weapons and equipment.

On 2 Dec Co A had contact with an NVA Recon Platoon vic EQ864625. Co B had light contact vic EQ850622. While Co C and Recondo's continued to Recondo Checkerboard in AO. At this time 2/502 Inf had the enemy encircled when received order to move in next 24 hours. 2/502 Inf decided to attack with Co B and Co C. This action disloced enemy force and drove the enemy into Go A.

On 3 Dec Co A wed contact with enemy forces at BQ865625 and BQ866627. Co's B and C continued to Recondo Checkerboard in AO. Co C 2/327 was placed under the OPCON 2/502 and located at PZ vic BQ855644. Flare ship was requested and used night of 3 Dec to aid Airborne Infantry in destroying the enemy.










Scheme of MANEUVER 15 NOV






