Brief History of the 501st, 502nd and 2nd Brigade (101st ABN DIV)

The 502nd, or "five-oh-deuce", was activated July 1, 1941 at Fort Benning, Georgia as the 502nd parachute infantry battalion, as an experimental unit formed to test the doctrine and tactics of parachute assaults. The 502nd entered combat in World War II on June 6, 1944, by jumping into NORMANDY, with allied forces landing on D-Day and the Battle of NORMANDY. Between 1945 and 1964. A major reorganization took place on 3 February 1964, when the 2nd Brigade of the 101st Airborne was activated at Fort Campbell, replacing the 1st Airborne Battle Group, 501st Infantry Regiment. The reorganization from the battle groups to brigades and battalions placed two battalions of the 502nd in different brigades of the 101st.



The 2nd Battalion, 502nd Infantry was in the 1st Brigade with 1-327th and 2-327th Infantry. Which deployed to Vietnam and arrived at Cam Ranh Bay, Vietnam on 29 July 1965, they were commanded by the most notable commander LTC Hank "The Gunfighter" Emerson.



The new 2nd Brigade's original organic battalions were the 1st and 2d Battalions, 501st Infantry, and the 1st Battalion, 502nd Infantry. December 1967 the 501st, 502nd and 2nd Brigade deployed by C-141 aircraft and arrived at BIEN HOA Airbase on 13 December 1967. Over the next five years, Soldiers of the "Ready to Go" Brigade participated in twelve campaigns, compiling of a distinguished combat record as well as an enviable reputation for success in the rehabilitation of a war-torn nation. The Brigade redeployed to Fort Campbell in April 1972.









During this week, in the span of 8 years since the 501st Infantry Regiment, 502nd Infantry Regiment and 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division deployed in support of the Vietnam War the following are from After Action Reports, Staff Duty Logs, and Personal Accounts. (* All items have been reproduced from the Unclassified / Declassified Holdings of the National Archives.)

13 October 1966

Operation SEWARD: In the morning C/2-502 IN moved south and joined A/2-502 IN in sweeping south to the blocking position established by B/2-502 IN (-), which had joined on the high ground south of the LRRP contact. The pattern of the earlier operation was repeated, as all companies reported sniper fire and sporadic contact in the sweep. Units scored with 5 VC body count and weapons and equipment captured. (HQ, 2-502 IN; After Action Report, Operation SEWARD; 28 October 1966)

13 October 1968

A/1-502 IN was operating at PHU VANG. B/1-502 IN had one and WIA, vicinity YD6930 by sniper, they returned fire but had negative assessment. C/1-502 IN conducted security of AN LO, mine sweep and local patrols and ambushes. D/1-502 IN received SA fire, vicinity YD6628. They returned fire with SA, MG and M-79. A sweep of the area produced 4 VC KIA. Recon captured documents from a sampan, vicinity YD7233. The VCS in sampan escaped.

13 October 1969

Operation REPUBLIC SQUARE: A/1-502 IN provided security at FSB ARSENAL and POHL BRIDGE. B/1-502 IN with C/1-502 IN, 3rd platoon OPCON remained at FSB BIRMINGHAM and provided security. C/1-502 IN conducted SRRP's and MAP's with negative results. D/1-502 IN (-) conducted SRRP's, MAP's and training with 1 RF platoon until 1705H when the D/1-502 IN, 1st platoon moved by air to YD783109 from stand-down at EAGLE BEACH. 1-502 IN BN, Recon platoon C/A from YD783109 to YD787089 – LZ Green. Platoon established MAF's in the same vicinity.

13 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: 1-501 IN BN moved by vehicle and air from the firebase to PHU BAI Combat Base and assumed the mission of division ready force and prepared for refresher training. (Operational Report – Lessons Learned, 101st ABN DIV (AM), Period Ending 31 October 1970)

13 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: 1-502 IN BN security detachment at POHL BRIDGE was notified to increase their alertness because of recent activities in the NAM HOA area.

13 October 1971

D/1-501 IN, 3rd Platoon found 2 BBT one pressure device one trip wire with suspected markers. Engineers contacted and destroyed BBT.

14 October 1968

1-502 IN BN continued RIF and ambushes with negative contact. The documents found on one of D/1-502 IN KIA's, of 13 Oct, showed that one of them was a company CO., HOANG VAN TRUNG, of K300B.

14 October 1968

Operation NEVADA EAGLE:

Operation Began (2-502 IN)

Locations: THUA THIEN Province, RVN.

Task Organization: A/2-502 IN, B/2-502 IN, C/2-502 IN, Recondos. Battalion Control: 3(-) A/326 ENG.

Mission: The 2d BN (ABN) while in the canopy, the 2-502 IN BN will conduct RIF operations within assigned AO in order to disrupt enemy's base and staging areas. While in the lowlands, the 2-502 IN BN will conduct local patrols, ambushes and ensure the security of major bridges and villages along QL 1 in assigned AO. The secondary mission will be pacification of the area through Madcaps and S5 functions. (AAR 31JAN1969)

14 October 1968

Operation NEVADA EAGLE: Having completed Operation SOMERSET PLAIN, the 2-502 IN BN returned to Operation NEVADA EAGLE. This part of NEVADA EAGLE was conducted in five phases with the mission depending on the sector of the AO being worked. While working in the canopy, units worked in company sized units by setting up patrol bases before sending out platoon size searching elements. Companies were kept within the 105 Artillery fan of the nearest fire base. Companies were also mutually supporting. Resupply cycle in the canopy was usually every five days. In most instances the lack of large LZ's (2 or more ships), precluded the use of CA's and the units usually ended up walking into the canopy. While working in the lowlands, our responsibility was the security of Bridges along QL1, FSB ROY (ZC057029), and FSB ANZIO (YD930075). In addition to security of these installations, the 2-502 IN BN conducted pacification programs of the population areas within our AO which consisted of local patrols, ambushes, cordons, and civil action projects.

14 - 21 October 1968

Operation NEVADA EAGLE: Phase I was conducted. At the beginning of this Phase, A/2-502 IN conducted local patrols vicinity YD873042, B/2-502 IN conducted local patrols vicinity YD670048, C/2-502 IN secured bridges 3 and 4 vicinity YD949069 and YD967063) and conducted local patrols and ambushes, D/2-502 IN secured bridge 1 and 3 vicinity YD913117 and YD936103 and conducted local patrols and ambushes, 2-502 IN BN, Recon platoon conducted patrols and ambushes vicinity YD886037, and E/2-502 IN (-) plus the CP was located at FSB ANZIO vicinity YD936075. Nothing of significance occurred during this period and ended with A/2-502 IN, B/2-502 IN, and Recon platoon being extracted from the canopy in preparation for the next phase.

14 October 1969

Operation REPUBLIC SQUARE: A/1-502 IN and B/1-502 IN continued to conduct security at FSB ARSENAL, POHL BRIDGE and FSB BIRMINGHAM. C/1-502 IN (-) MAP's and RIF operations with negative results. D/1-502 IN conducted SRRP's, MAP's and training in conjunction with 221st RF Company, 1st platoon to vicinity YD752111 and YD783107. 1-502 IN BN, Recon platoon RIF to YD794081 with negative results.

14 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: The 1-502 IN BN continued Operation JEFFERSON GLEN in sector Golf making maximum use of SP's and NA's with negative results.

14 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: 2-502 IN BN with its CP at OP CHECKMATE continued reconnaissance in force operations in operational coordination with the 3rd IN Regiment (ARVN). The 1-501 IN BN remained at PHU BAI Combat Base, continued the mission of division ready force and conducted battalion refresher training. The 2BDE CP remained at PHU BAI Combat Base. The 1-502 IN BN continued search and attack operations in the FS/OB ARSENAL area while the 2-501 IN BN continued operations in the FS/OB BRICK Area. (Operational Report – Lessons Learned, 101st ABN DIV (AM), Period Ending 31 October 1970)

14 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: A/2-502 IN, 3rd platoon was laying concertina wire around OP CHECKMATE. While driving engineer stakes, the element hit what appeared to be a 105mm dud round. The dud round detonated, wounding four US Soldiers. At 1115H, three kilometers east of STELLA, a trooper from D/1-501 IN, 2nd platoon was wounded when detonated an unknown type booby trap with a pressure plate type firing device. (Operational Report – Lessons Learned, 101st ABN DIV (AM), Period Ending 31 October 1970)

15 October 1966

Operation SEWARD: Extraction and redeployment to the original company AO's began. The technique of leaving stay behind platoons, which had been used on the extraction earlier, was followed when all three companies left stay behind platoons. The last platoon was extracted and joined its parent company on 18 October, after C/2-502 IN, 2nd platoon discovered a cache of rice and small arms ammo, and A/2-502 IN, 4th platoon had successfully ambushed 2 VC in their role as stay behind platoons. (HQ, 2-502 IN; After Action Report, Operation SEWARD; 28 October 1966)

15 – 16 October 1968

Operation NEVADA EAGLE: 2BDE, 101st ABN DIV (Airmobile), continued to conduct offensive operations in support of Operation NEVADA EAGLE to limit and disrupt attempts made by the enemy to extort the VN rice production throughout the coastal plains area and to seek out and destroy enemy forces and installations in the 2BDE area of operations. Contact was light during the reporting period. Toady's statistics: 1 PF KHA; Enemy assessment – 1 VC POW, 1 .38 cal pistol.

1-501 IN BN

A/1-501 IN (-) working with 1 RF and 1 PF platoon occupied night position vicinity ZD081127 with ambushes ZD098118, ZD085102, ZD091112 and ZD0776129. Conducted RIF to vicinity ZD080110 and ZD087108. A/1-501 IN, 2nd platoon ambushed vicinity YD984182, conducted RIF to YD985176 then at 1558H from PZ vicinity YD985176 moved by CH-47 to LZ ZD083128, closed LZ 1607H.

B/1-501 IN (-) occupied night position vicinity YD834217 with ambushes at YD836215 and TYD832219. B/1-501 IN, 3rd platoon ambushed YD807251 and YD813249. At 0858H B/1-501 IN (-) conducted eagle flights, from PZ vicinity YD837217 to LZ's YD810222, YD801226, YD802230, last lift closed at 0958H. Conducted RIF to vicinity YD8123. At 1750H vicinity YD817232, B/1-501 IN (-) captured 1 VC with .38 cal pistol, he was evacuated to LZ SALLY at 1840H. B/1-501 IN, 3rd platoon conducted patrols vicinity YD801247, YD805247 and YD813248.

C/1-501 IN OPCON 2-17 CAV.

D/1-501 IN (-) provided security for COCO Beach with ambush at YD865303, D/1-501 IN, 1st platoon provided security for FSB SANDY with ambush YD879252. 2 platoon cushion vehicles with 8 men each from D/1-501 IN patrol village at YD860230 and YD850230.

Recon Platoon (-) working with 1 PF platoon occupied night position at YD877247, conducted RIF to YD889245. At 0930H vicinity YD888245 sustained 1 PF KHA from a BBT 105 round. 4.2" mortar was fired into the BBT'ed area and the







RIF was continued to YD886250. 2 squads of Recon working with 1 PF platoon from night position vicinity YD867247 conducted RIF to YD870259.

Remarks: At 0900H vicinity YD884252 1 VN woman tripped unknown type mine or BBT resulting in woman being killed.

2-501 IN BN

2-501 IN BN (-) to include TAC CP, A/2-501 IN, C/2-501 IN, D/2-501 IN and Recon platoon moved by CH-47 from LZ SALLY/FSB T-BONE to 1BDE AO and reverted to 1BDE OPCON at 1457H.

A/2-501 IN staged at LZ SALLY. At 1330H moved by CH-47 to LZ vicinity ZD117004, closed 1418H.

B/2-501 IN (-) provided security for FSB T-BONE. B/2-501 IN, 1st platoon ambushed vicinity YD643189 and YD645190, conducted RIF to FSB T-BONE. B/2-501 IN, 2nd platoon occupied OP APACHE. At 1005H, B/2-501 IN reverted OPCON to 1-502 IN BN.

C/2-501 IN staged at LZ SALLY. At 1252H moved by CH-47 to LZ vicinity ZD151012, closed 1335H.

D/2-501 IN (-) occupied night position vicinity YD594130. At 0728H D/2-501 IN (-) was extracted from PZ vicinity YD595131 to LZ SALLY. Closed 0808H and linked up with D/2-501 IN, 1st platoon which was extracted 151838HOCT to LZ SALLY from the same PZ. At 1417H moved by CH-47 to LZ vicinity YD116104, closed 1457H.

Recon platoon provided security at FSB T-BONE. At 1240H moved by CH-47 to LZ vicinity YD116014, closed at 1220H.

1-502 IN BN

A/1-502 IN (-) occupied night position at PHU VANG. A/1-502 IN (-) occupied strong points along QL 551, POL pipeline, POL pumping station, security at LCU RAMP and liaison at HUE Bridges. A/1-502 IN, 3rd platoon OPCON to C/1-502 IN, at 1610H OPCON B/2-501 IN.

B/1-502 IN occupied night position at YD697296 with ambushes vicinity YD679288, YD697287 and YD688301. Conducted platoon size RIF operation vicinity YD687296.

C/1-502 IN provided security for AN LO BRIDGE with ambush at YD614298. A/1-502 IN, 3rd platoon occupied fortified OP's on QL 1. C/1-502 IN provided bridge and mine sweep security. At 1400H, C/1-502 IN, 2nd platoon relieved A/1-502 IN, 3rd platoon of the OP security mission. At 1600H, A/1-502 IN, 3rd platoon moved by CH-47 from PZ YD605314 to FSB T-BONE, closed at 1610H at which time became OPCON B/2-501 IN.

D/1-502 IN occupied night position at YD667297 with ambush at YD654294 and YD670293. At 2100H CP and D/1-502 IN, 3rd platoon conducted night RIF to YD664308. Conducted platoon sized RIF vicinity night location.

Recon platoon marshaled LZ SALLY and assumed RRF mission.

C/2-34 Armor, 3rd platoon OPCON C/1-502 IN.

- 1-3 ARVN Regiment, 1st company occupied night position at YD619338, conducted platoon sized RIF vicinity night position.
- 1-3 ARVN Regiment, 2nd company occupied night position at YD613333, conducted platoon sized RIF vicinity night position.
- 1-3 ARVN Regiment, 3rd company occupied night position at YD658326, conducted platoon sized RIF vicinity night position.

Remarks: At 0817H, 2 PF platoons conducted eagle flights from PZ FSB OMAHA, to LZ's YD713330, YD717330, YD724333, YD726327, YD723313 and YD735328. At 1005H, 1-502 IN BN assumed OPCON of B/2-501 IN and 2-501 IN BN AO. A/1-502 IN, 3^{rd} platoon OPCON to B/2-501 IN at 1610H.

Beginning at 0600H, 1-502 IN in cooperation with QUANG GIEN PF, HUONG TRA PF and 1-3 ARVN Regiment, 1st Company will cordon and search the village of HA LANG located vicinity YD660285. 1-3 ARVN, 1st Company will cordon from YD646288 to YD662290, link with D/1-502 IN which will cordon from YD662290 to YD676295. B/1-502 IN, 1st platoon will cordon from YD677290 to YD670284. 3rd PF platoons from HUONG TRA will block from YD670284 to YD646287. At 0700H, 2 PF platoons and 15 Special Branch Police will RIF and search from YD646287 to YD660285. 2 PF platoons and Special Branch Police will RIF and search from YD674293.

HHC Security platoon secured minesweep N and S from LZ SALLY.

15 October 1969

Operation REPUBLIC SQUARE: All elements of the 1-502 IN BN continued to conduct their same mission with negative results. A/1-502 IN C/A was conducted with 2 platoons from the 177th RF Company from NAM HOA District. The platoons went into 2 LZ's at YD790113 and YD802117. Both LZ's were green and the sweep operations had negative results.

15 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: General Henessay visited FSB ARSENAL, arrived at 1043H and departed at 1113H. Tropical storm warning received, with 50 knots winds expected within 48 hours and expected to last through 20 October. All units were instructed to order necessary log to carry them through.

15 October 1971

1-501 IN BN, Recon platoon in the vicinity ZC116984 found 4 NVA/VC green plastic rain capes and 2 NVA/VC rain jackets in open area near 2' trail. Last activity two days.

16 - 17 October 1968

Operation NEVADA EAGLE: 2BDE, 101st ABN DIV (Airmobile), continued to conduct offensive operations in support of Operation NEVADA EAGLE to limit and disrupt attempts made by the enemy to extort the VN rice production throughout the coastal plains area and to seek out and destroy enemy forces and installations in the 2BDE area of operations. There was no contact during the reporting period. Today's statistics: No friendly casualties; Enemy assessment – 5 suspects detained.

1-501 IN BN

A/1-501 IN (-) occupied night position ZD081277 with ambushes ZD090118 and ZD085192. At 2206H, A/1-501 IN, 1st platoon conducted roving patrols from ZD076129 to ZD067136, A/1-501 IN, 3rd platoon from ZD076134 to ZD070139. During the day conducted RIF operations vicinity night position while continuing to work with 2 PF platoon.

B/1-501 IN (-) occupied night position vicinity YD809226 with ambushes YD807231 and YD807227. B/1-501 IN, 3rd platoon ambushed vicinity YD807247 and YD805248. B/1-501 IN (-) conducted eagle flights from PZ YD808226 to LZ's vicinity YD857240 and YD866238. The last lift closed LZ at 1059H then conducted local patrols vicinity LZ's. At 1530H vicinity YD846225, B/1-501 IN (-) detained 2 female VCS.

C/1-501 IN OPCON 2-17 CAV.

D/1-501 IN (-) provided security for COCO Beach and ambushed at YD863307. D/1-501 IN, 1st platoon provided security for FSB SANDY and ambushed at YD810250. At 1345H, 16 personnel from D/1-501 IN (-) conducted search via PACV boats of villages vicinity YD8422, YD8522 and YD8523. At 1555H vicinity YD847225 detained 3 VCS. Patrol closed COCO Beach at 1700H.

Recon platoon (-) ambushed at YD878240. Recon platoon, 2nd squad ambushed at YD855247. Recon consolidated at 1153H vicinity YD875235 and conducted local patrol working with 1 PF platoon.

C/1-502 IN provided security for AN LO BRIDGE and ambushed vicinity YD600210, YD605310 and YD611212. C/2-501 IN, 2nd platoon occupied fortified OP's along QL 1. At 1313H from PZ vicinity AN LO BRIDGE moved by CH-47 to LZ YD696297, closed LZ at 1431H. At 1351H, C/2-501 IN was released from bridge security responsibility. At 1440H, 3 fire teams conducted eagle flights from PZ YD696297 to LZ's YD705305, YD712311 and YD644307, closed LZ's at 1457H, and conducted local search operations. D/1-502 IN occupied night position at YD656296, with ambush at YD675296. At 0502H established blocking position from YD647290 to YD660289. At 0905H, D/2-501 IN, 3rd platoon conducted RIF from YD647290 to YD6528. At 1435H, D/2-501 IN, 2nd platoon conducted eagle flights from PZ YD656294 to LZ's YD668303, YD660303, YD655303, YD667289 and YD671294, closed LZ at 1459H and conducted local search operations. At 1545H, D/2-501 IN, 2nd platoon was extracted from PZ's YD668303, YD660303, YD663303, YD667289, YD671294 to LZ YD656294, closed LZ 1628H.

 $Recon\ platoon\ marshalled\ at\ LZ\ SALLY\ and\ at\ 1700H\ was\ lifted\ from\ LZ\ SALLY\ to\ LZ\ YD631248,\ closed\ LZ\ at\ 1715H.$

16 October 1968

1-502 IN BN had negative enemy contact on this day. It was, however, and important day as it was the day, we assumed security of FSB T-BONE. B/1-502 IN was lifted to FSB T-BONE at 1600H.

16 October 1969

Operation REPUBLIC SQUARE: A/1-502 IN provided security at FSB ARSENAL and POHL BRIDGE. B/1-502 IN continued to provide security at FSB BIRMINGHAM. C/1-502 IN RIF with negative results. D/1-502 IN continued to conduct SRRP's, MAP's, training and RIF operations with 1 platoon from the 221st RF Company. 1-502 IN BN, Recon platoon conducted MAP's vicinity YD796075.

16 October 1970

Operation JEFFERSON GLEN: B/1-502 IN vicinity 777082 found one rear casing for a 122mm rocket in a stream bed. It was old and rusty and may have been washed down the stream.

17 - 18 October 1968

Operation NEVADA EAGLE: 2BDE, 101st ABN DIV (Airmobile) continued to conduct offensive operations in support of Operation NEVADA EAGLE to limit and disrupt attempts made by the enemy to extort the VN rice production throughout the coastal plains area and to seek out and destroy enemy forces and installations in the 2BDE area of operations. Rescue efforts started immediately, recovery SGT Ashman and LCPL Moore. SGT Ashman and one of the rescuers reported seeing a third man in the water prior to his rescue. The crash reportedly occurred in the vicinity of grid coordinates (GC) ZD170137. Extensive searches failed to locate SP5 Mason, but on 21 October the body of W01 Daugherty was found on the beach in the vicinity of (GC) Au844059, some thirteen kilometers from the crash site. PFC Richard J. Price (C/1-501 IN) was awarded the Purple Heart Medal (Posthumously) for military merit and for wounds received which resulted in his death while on combat operation when hit by hostile small arms fire in the THUA THIEN Province, Republic of Vietnam. PFC Price was admitted to a military hospital, placed on the VSI list, and later evacuated to Japan where he expired.

CPL Allen J. Smith (A/2-502 IN) was awarded the Bronze Star Medal (Posthumously) CPL Smith died as result of injuries received while at a firing position when an artillery round detonated for unknown causes in the THUA THIEN Province, Republic of Vietnam. CPL Smith was admitted to a military medical facility and later expired.

SP4 Ralph N. Lee (A/1-501 IN) was awarded the Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart Medal and Air Medal (Posthumously) for wounds received which resulted in his death when he was killed while on a combat operation when the area came under attack from an unknown source 4km South of PHU BAI Airfield, in the THUA THIEN Province, Republic of Vietnam.




SP4 Horton S. Coker Jr. (C/2-502 IN) was awarded the Bronze Star Medal, Army Commendation Medal and Purple Heart Medal (Posthumously) for military merit and for wounds received which resulted in his death as the result of gunshot wound to the head in hostile ground action in the PHU YEN Province, Republic of Vietnam.

17 October 1968



SP5 James P. Mason (HHC/1-502 IN) drowned while passenger on military helicopter on naval gunfire adjustment mission when a OH-6A helicopter crashed into the sea and sank shortly after take-off from a US Naval Ship USS Eversole, 6km northwest of Cape Chon May, in the THUA THIEN Province, Republic of Vietnam. SP5 Mason remains were not recovered. SP5 Mason was held by the Department of the Army to have been absent in a pay status pursuant to provisions from 17 October 1968, date of death 26 December 1968, date evidence of death was received by the Department of the Army.









STRIKE HISTORY (Citation's and Awards):

17 October 1968

MAJ Paul F. Wertz (C/2-501 IN) was awarded the Bronze Star Medal with Valor (5-OLC) for heroism in connection with ground combat against a hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam on 17 October 1968. Major (then Captain) Wertz distinguished himself while serving as commanding officer of Company C, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 501st Infantry, during combat operations near the village of PHU LOC, Republic of Vietnam. While the company was engaged in a large sweep designed to route the enemy from fortified positions, an element came under heavily hostile fire. After assessing the situation, Major Wertz moved forward through enemy automatic weapons fire to personally direct the besieged element's flanking attack. Through informants gathered through the sweep, it was determined that an estimated battalion of North Vietnamese Army regulars intended to ambush the company. Due to the enemy's numerical superiority and proximity, Major Wertz elected to withdraw his men and call in effective artillery fire. He personally supervised an orderly withdrawal of his company and, despite heavy enemy fire, stayed in the area until assured that all elements were safely withdrawn. Major Wertz's personal bravery and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army. (HQ, 101st ABN DIV; General Orders Number 15323, 20 December 1970)

19 October 1968



CPT Robert G. Mayor (A/2-501 IN) was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations involving conflict with an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam, while serving with Company A, 2d Battalion, 501st Infantry, 101st Airborne Division. Captain Mayor distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions during the period from 19 October through 25 October 1968 while leading a reconnaissance-in-force operation in the enemy-infiltrated mountains near Da Nang. Late in the afternoon of 19 October, Captain Mayor detected movement on a nearby ridge and quickly positioned his company in an ambush formation. When the North Vietnamese force entered the killing zone, he imitated an attack with Claymore mines and grenades. After the successful skirmish, the unit continued to seek out the enemy. During the early morning hours of 25 October, the company's night position was hit by a hostile force that penetrated the defensive line and swarmed toward the command post. Captain Mayor immediately ordered his men to fire into the center of the camp, even though the members of the command post had only scant protection. After the perimeter troops, had unleashed a barrage on the invaders, the command group engaged the fleeing enemy soldiers at close range. Captain Mayor shot one hostile soldier and used his empty rifle to bludgeon another to death. The remnant North Vietnamese force fled into the jungle. Later in the day as communist mortar rounds began to pound the hill, Captain Mayor decided to break camp and capture a nearby hill held by a well-entranced enemy force. He located the site of the hostile mortar emplacement and called in artillery strikes on the North Vietnamese entrenchments. When the enemy soldiers were forced out of their bunkers by the devastating barrage, he led an assault up the hill-side. Suddenly his men were pinned down by strafing machine gun fire. Running and crawling forward through the fusillade, Captain Mayor neared the machine gun emplacement which he destroyed with a well-thrown grenade. Shortly afterward, his men successfully routed the enemy force and secured the hill. Captain Mayor's extraordinary heroism and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army. (HQ, USARV; General Orders Number 3398; 04 September 1969)
